Once complete, Amara will boast 12.9-hectares of green spaces for residents to access. Included in this is a 10-hectare fauna movement corridor adjacent the Pimpama River which is being rehabilitated with native vegetation.

Amara comprises 5,700m2 of activated parklands, incorporating recycled hard landscape materials, and green leafy spaces for shade and picnics.

Every home constructed will include energy efficiency treatments such as solar panels, state of the art insulation and appliances, as well as an underlying Truecore steel framework.

The private garden designs detail drought tolerant plant species to reduce demand on local water supply.
